



What is your favourite genre of music?





How much would you pay for a music magazine?










What do you prefer the cover of a magazine to look like?



The participants have all stated that they do not mind what sex the artist on the front cover is. This means that I can experiment with both male and female artists on the front and make a decision of what I believe looks better.


